Attendance Policy

As we enter the colder months, we understand that children may catch coughs, colds, and other illnesses. To help ensure a smooth process during this time, we would like to remind all parents and guardians of our attendance protocols. If your child is absent, please follow the procedures outline in our police (see attachment), and remember that if your child is absent for three consecutive days, a "Safe and Well" check will be required.

This check helps us ensure the well-being of all our children, especially when illness is more common. Please refer to the attached attendance procedures for further details. Your cooperation helps us maintain a healthy and safe environment for everyone!

Day 1	Parents must contact the school via class dojo by 8:45am to inform and explain any absence. Children who arrive after the register is closed (8:55am) are marked absent. Office staff will follow up any unexplained absence by contacting parents by phone to understand why a pupil is absent and when they are likely to return to school.	If on any of these days, we are concerned about a child's wellbeing, we may conduct an unannounced home visit to ensure the child is safe and well.
Day 2	Parents must contact the school via class dojo by 8:45am to inform and explain any absence. Where no contact has been made with parents, our office staff will persist, and telephone all listed contacts. If contact is not made, a home visit will take place.	
Day 3	Parents must contact the school via class dojo by 8:45am to inform and explain any absence. A member of Mere Green will contact the parent to arrange a wellbeing check with the child via zoom/telephone. In the event of a child's whereabouts are still unknown, contact will be made with our PCSO and children's services (this applies to all children).	

Late Arrivals/ Early Pick Ups/Appointments

To help us maintain accurate attendance records and ensure the safety of all our students, we kindly ask that you sign your child in at the school office if they arrive late, are going or returning from an appointment, or are being picked up early for any reason.

Building works

We would like to inform you that Phase 1 of the upcoming building works will take place over the next few weeks. This phase will involve two days during school hours, followed by two weekends to minimise disruption to the school day. Further updates will be provided once this phase is complete.

Personal Items Reminder

To ensure a safe and focused learning environment, students are not permitted to bring personal sports equipment, such as footballs or basketballs, or other personal belongings to school. All necessary equipment for activities will be provided by the school. This policy helps prevent loss, damage, or distractions during the school day. We appreciate your cooperation in reinforcing this guideline with your child.

Tip of the Week: Building Positive Communication at Home and School

Positive communication is crucial because it fosters understanding, trust, and collaboration between people. Whether at home, in school, or in any community, speaking respectfully and listening actively helps prevent misunderstandings, reduces conflict, and creates a supportive environment. It allows individuals to express their concerns or emotions without escalating tension, promoting healthier relationships. In challenging situations, positive communication helps to focus on solutions rather than blame, encouraging teamwork and empathy. By communicating constructively, we can build stronger connections and address issues more effectively, creating a more positive atmosphere for everyone involved.

At Mere Green Primary School, we truly believe that strong collaboration between school and home is vital to our children's wellbeing. We also know that children learn in many different ways, and the importance of modelling behaviour we would like our children to adopt is so important. In order to support our in-school work with children about positive communication and conflict resolution, we are introducing a 'tip' section in our newsletters, to give practical examples of what positive communication looks like that you can discuss with your children at home. Hopefully you will recognise yourself in these examples, or learn some new skills to support your relationships within our school community

1: Set a Calm and Respectful Tone

Theme: How we say things is as important as what we say.

- Parent with Teacher: When discussing concerns with your child's teacher, start calmly and respectfully, even if you're upset. For example, instead of saying, "You're failing my child," try "I'm concerned about [child's name]'s progress. Can we discuss how we can help them together?"
- Children with Children: Teach your child to resolve conflicts with friends calmly. Instead of yelling, encourage them to say, "I feel upset when you don't share. Can we take turns?"
- Parent with Child: If your child misbehaves, take a deep breath before reacting. Instead of shouting, try saying, "I'm upset because you didn't listen. Let's talk about what happened."
