## Eduspot App

If you use the Eduspot App, all communication from Teachers2Parents will go into the App and not to your phone or email address. It is worthwhile checking your App on a regular basis to see what communication has been sent to you via text and email. If you are still not receiving any messages via the App, our advice would be to delete the App and receive communication directly to your phone and email address.

If after deleting the App, you still do not receive any messages and if you have changed your email address/phone number and let us know, please contact your phone provider.

All letters will be sent out electronically eduspot on a Tuesday. Class Dojo is used for celebration of children's achievements, this is not a communication platform.

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### Whole School Update

#### E-Safety

We have recently experienced worries surrounding text messages being sent out of school hours. Whilst we cannot control what happens outside of school, we would like to share some simple guidelines that may be useful to share with you children.



#### Simple Rules for Text Messaging and Etiquette

**Texting doesn't replace talking**. Texting shouldn't take the place of all one-on-one interactions with their friends. If you want your child to bond with their friends, encourage that they spend time together.

**Keep it short and sweet.** Text messages should be short and to-the-point. If a "conversation" goes on for more than a few minutes, encourage your child to pick up the phone and continue the conversation that way.

**Don't text in front of others.** It's important to understand the meaning of "phubbing," which is texting with another person while spending time with a friend. It's can be seen as rude at any age and can hurt feelings. Text messaging and phone etiquette requires your child to think about how their actions make other people feel.

**Think before you text.** Teach your child to refrain from texting a friend if they're in a fight or are angry with one another. Ask your child to wait until they've calmed down, and then encourage them to work things out in person or over the phone.

**It's all about context.** Children should know that sometimes text messages are misunderstood because of a lack of context. The text message recipient can't see the sender's facial expressions or hear their tone of voice. Jokes and sarcastic comments may cause hard feelings if they're passed along in a text message and misunderstood.

**Keep content in mind.** Teach your child that they should refrain from delivering bad news in a text message, i.e. "I hear that our teacher is leaving!"

**Be kind.** Children should understand that they are responsible for what they text to other people. Teach your child to refrain from gossiping about others, and being unkind in general.

Text at the right time. Your child should be mindful of the right time to text and should refrain from texting after a set time to prevent any sleep disturbances. The same applies if your family is going out for a nice meal or enjoying an activity together. This is also important when waiting for a reply from a previous message to prevent the recipient feeling overwhelmed.

**Texting is a privilege, not a right.** Texting should be regarded as a privilege, and your child should know that bad behaviour will result in the loss of that privilege. Remind your child that part of the responsibility of using a phone is following phone etiquette rules. That's the responsibility of growing up.

### Energy Saving Tip from the Eco Team

Save energy by avoiding using standby on your electronics. Always switch off appliances at the wall and turn energy saving mode on when using your devices.

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### Phase 1 (Nursery, Reception and Year 1)

Nursery have had a spa-tacular wellbeing week! They were treated to natural yoghurt face masks and cucumber to fully unwind and chill out. Bookings to open soon!

They were also privileged to enjoy a performance from their older peers who play the ukulele. Not only did they get to watch a wonderful performance but they were able to have a go playing the instruments themselves with the help of a friend. Reception have been preparing for the arrival of their chicks by learning about the story Henny Penny. They have created some lovely independent writing and illustrations based around the story and are super excited to meet and look after their very own!

Meanwhile in maths, they have been exploring the composition of the number eight. They have partitioned the number in various ways and have used practical objects as well as their own recordings to demonstrate their understanding.







Thank you to our wonderful Year 1 families who attended the phonics workshop two weeks ago. Where has that time gone to? It was so heart warming to have you in the building with your children learning. It was certainly a moment that many of us have been dreaming of since last September. We hope that you found the session useful and that you enjoyed coming into school.





Since then, the children have been learning about numbers to 50, counting forwards and backwards and representing these numbers. They have started to learn about coding and they have identified a range of different items that they can program using a code. They showed a good understanding that a computer code is a set of rules and instructions which is made up of words and numbers. In science, they have been poo detectives and identified animals which are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.









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## Phase 2 (Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4)

Year 2 have had the wonderful opportunity to develop their cricket skills with specialist coaching coming from Rob at Warwickshire County Cricket Club. They have developed their throwing and catching skills, using force to hit the wickets. In addition, they've also started honing their batting technique and working together when fielding. The children are loving the game and have shown so much enthusiasm to learn even on blustery days.









In English, the children have been exploring the text 'Little Red Riding Hood'. To show their understanding of the narrative, they used role play to act out sections of the story, while other children narrated the story, using vocabulary from our model write. Can you guess which character our children are playing.







In Year 3, the children had a wonderful time learning about the Egyptians during a themed Egyptian Day. With an expert coming into school, they learnt more about the mummification process, hieroglyphics, the ancient Egyptian culture, what the Egyptian's believed in, ancient Egyptian language and so much more. We even learned a couple of ancient Egyptian games.













Year 3 also had a brilliant Comic Relief. We learned how to tell jokes and even created our own. In addition to this, we learned so much about different charities and their purposes.



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
## Phase Three (Year 5 and Year 6)

Year 5 continue to wow us with their homework projects based on their Geography topic, 'Rivers'. From miniature clay models, to giant labelled cardboard constructions, the staff have been blown away with their enthusiasm and application of knowledge.





We are really getting stuck into our new class novel, 'Journey to the River Sea', by Eva Ibbotson. It's based in the wilderness of Brazil and follows an orphan, Maia. We read it each day and explicitly learn and explore new vocabulary from it. Why not ask your child about what has happened in the story so far?



Finally, year 5 have received post this week from their French pen pals! They were thrilled to read handwritten letters and have now written responses back. We have posted them this week so hopefully our fellow students in France will receive them soon!







Well-Being Week has been welcomed by year 6s to give them a much-needed break from their SATs revision. Many of our year 6s joined in with 'Wake and Shake' in the morning and they simply couldn't get enough of the dance practise for our flash mob! We definitely need more dance breaks during the school day!





French in year 6 included them writing about their 'Special Circle of People'. They've worked hard to apply new learnt vocabulary into grammatically correct sentences. This will come home with them next week - so watch this space!





Year 6's class novel is 'Hitler's Canary' by Sandi Toksvig, which supplements their History topic. It's a beautifully written account of how ordinary people in Denmark in WW2 did some extraordinarily brave things. The main character, Bamse, is only 11 when the Nazis take over Denmark. Our 6's are delving deep into pertinent themes and debating topics maturely.





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### Quick Links

A great website to help overcome transport issues getting to and from school, or any route in general as it tells you what public transport is available near you https://moovitapp.com

You need to select the "West Midlands' region on the drop down, then you enter your postcode in the 'Start' field, then enter the school postcode (B75 5BL) in the 'End' field and it gives you the details on how long it takes to walk from your house to the bus stop, the bus numbers that are available for the route, the time it takes to travel on the bus, and then the walking distance from the bus stop to the school. You also have options to set the desired arrival time and date. This information is great as it can help you to prepare your journey ahead of time. You can also select rail options too.

### Parking

Please can we politely request that you consider our neighbours when parking near school. There is ample parking available at Sainsbury's and Lidl, and the additional pedestrian crossings that have been recently installed makes it even safer to park and cross the Mere Green Road. Please be considerate of our neighbours with smaller car parks and leave their car park spaces for their staff and customers.
